

At [REDACTED] request the interview was held at the St. Michael's Parish Rectory. [REDACTED] requested that Fr. Mario Orrigo be present for the interview. [REDACTED] was very anxious about our meeting, repeating on several occasions that he did not want to do anything that would bring harm to the Church. [REDACTED] admitted to a long term struggle with alcohol addiction and PTSD resulting from his service as a Marine in Viet Nam during the Tet offensive.

[REDACTED] is divorced and currently lives with his mother in the family home in which he was raised. He works as an independent electrical contractor although he reports not being able to take on any new jobs since January when the media first began to report on clergy sexual abuse. He reports being unable to eat or sleep and an increase in alcohol consumption. He recently told his mother and sister about an incidence of sexual molestation by Fr. Jon Martin during the winter of 1965 when [REDACTED] was 14 years old.

[REDACTED] offered the following details regarding this one time incident. Fr. Martin had become close to the [REDACTED] family and was a frequent visitor during a period when he served at St. Michael's parish. [REDACTED] remembers him as being loud and funny and often very physical with lots of touching and hugging. On one occasion Fr. Martin invited [REDACTED] and his brother [REDACTED] to go to Fr. Martin's family chalet in New Hampshire for a weekend to assist him with shoveling, cutting firewood and other chores.

When they arrived at the chalet on this particular weekend [REDACTED] reports that Fr. Martin was making him nervous with a lot of physical contact, so he stayed close to his brother. The immediately went to work shoveling and working outside.

On Saturday when his brother was outside [REDACTED] reports that Fr. Martin came up behind him and embraced him in a tight bear hug. He began kissing him on the back of the neck and then suddenly pushed his hand inside his pants and began fondling and groping him. [REDACTED] reports squirming away from him and then his brother came back in the house. He reports not leaving his brother's side after this incident. They returned home on Sunday morning at [REDACTED] insistence that he wanted to go home.

[REDACTED] was deeply distressed and weeping while reporting this incident. He stated that he never attended Mass again except for funerals as an adult.

[REDACTED] understands that a report will be sent to the DA although he is concerned about his privacy and confidentiality. We discussed his returning to the VA for alcohol treatment and [REDACTED] is interested in beginning therapy. We will work with him to find a local therapist. He will also stay in contact with Fr. Mario. Fr. Mario's previous military service seemed to provide a natural bond of confidence between them.



Father Martin presently resides at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] My client has received notice that Father Martin's residence is next to a playground.
